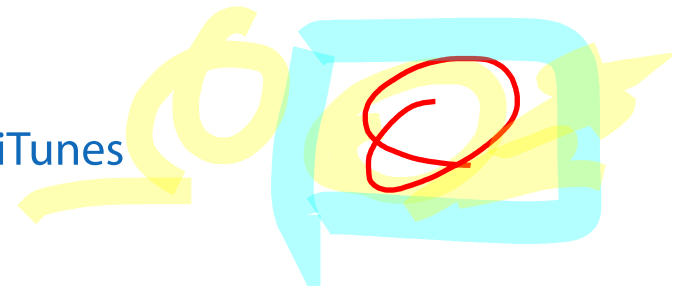


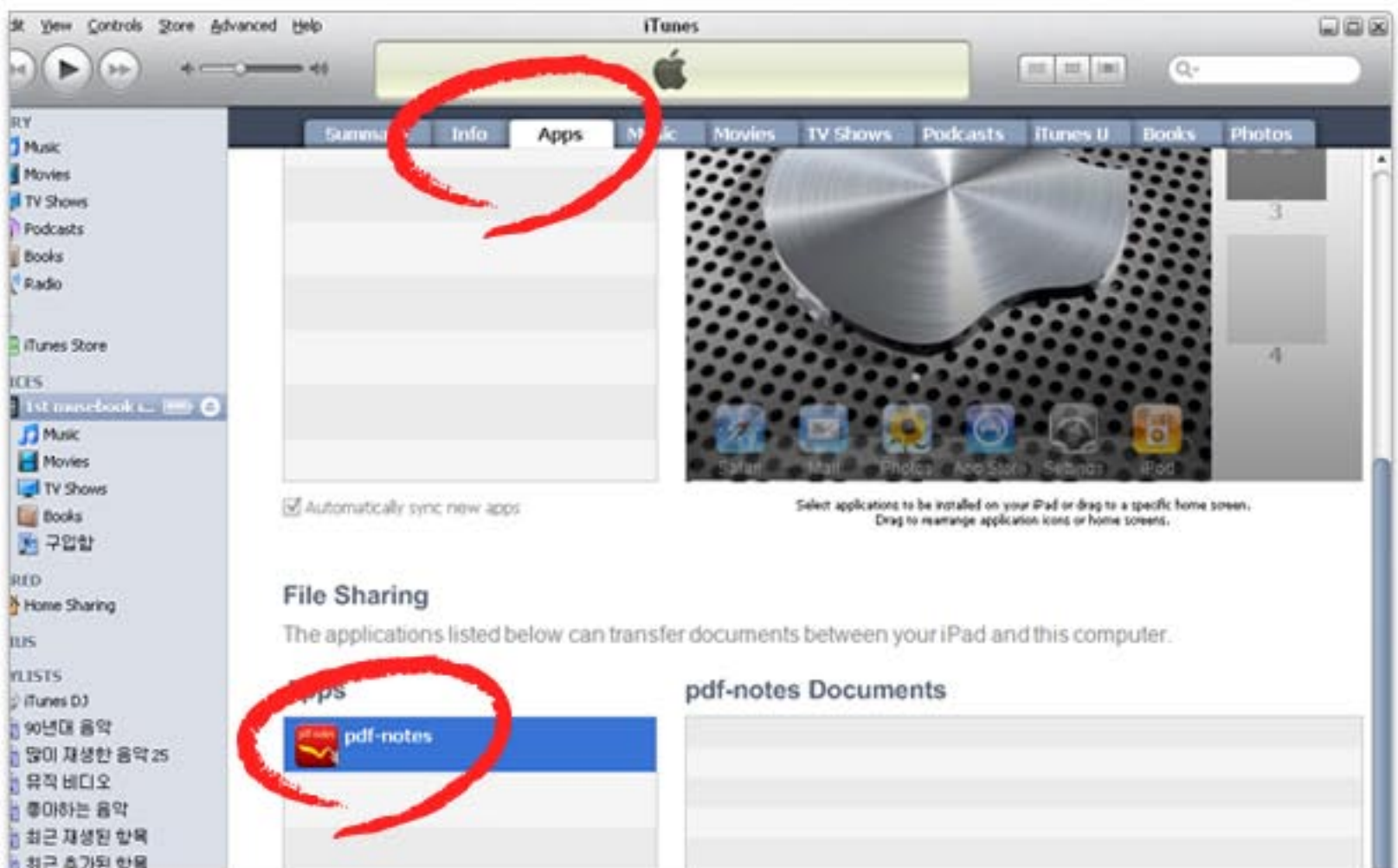
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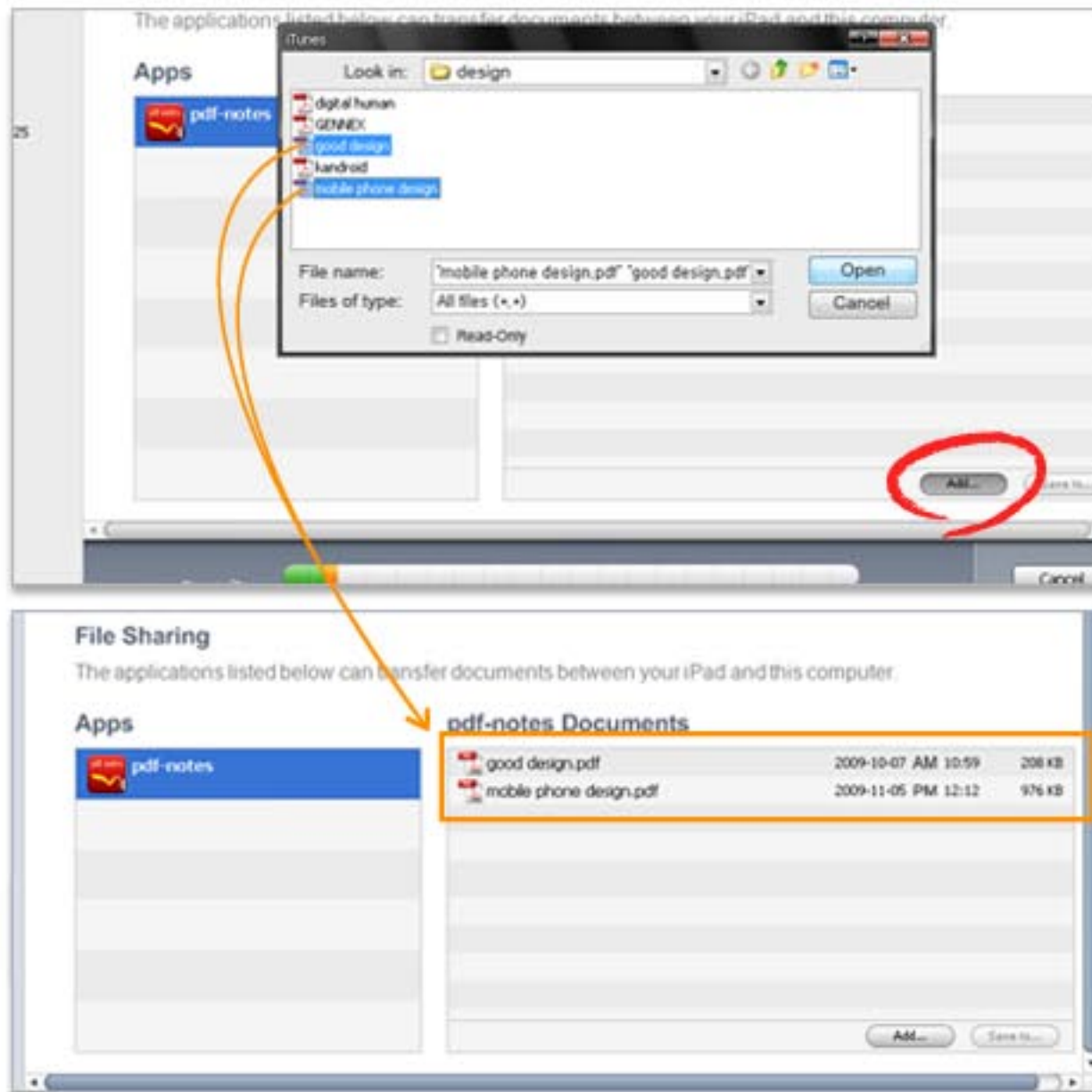


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- 1 iOS only shows top 10 applications in order of install time. Therefore, if you install or update pdf-notes recently, pdf-notes will disappear from open-in menu. (this is a limitation of iOS not a bug of pdf-notes)



- 2 please remove the other (low priority) apps listed on open-in menu until pdf-notes is listed on.



- 3 finally, pdf-notes listed on open-in menu.

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pre-open



- 1 when you open a file at first, it may take a couple of seconds or minutes as much as the amount of the pages; if you can't wait, you may press "pre-open."



TIP

pre-opening always restarts from the current page after you changed it (for example, go to 500 page directly); therefore, please don't wait until "pre-open" finished.

- 2 when you "pre-open" a pdf document, pdf-notes shows how many pages prepared; while "pre-opening," it may cause memory lack troubles or not.

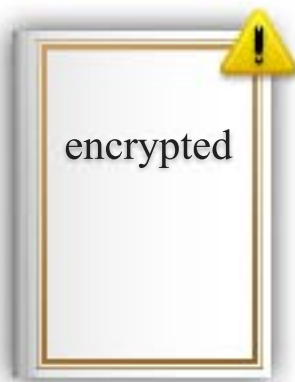
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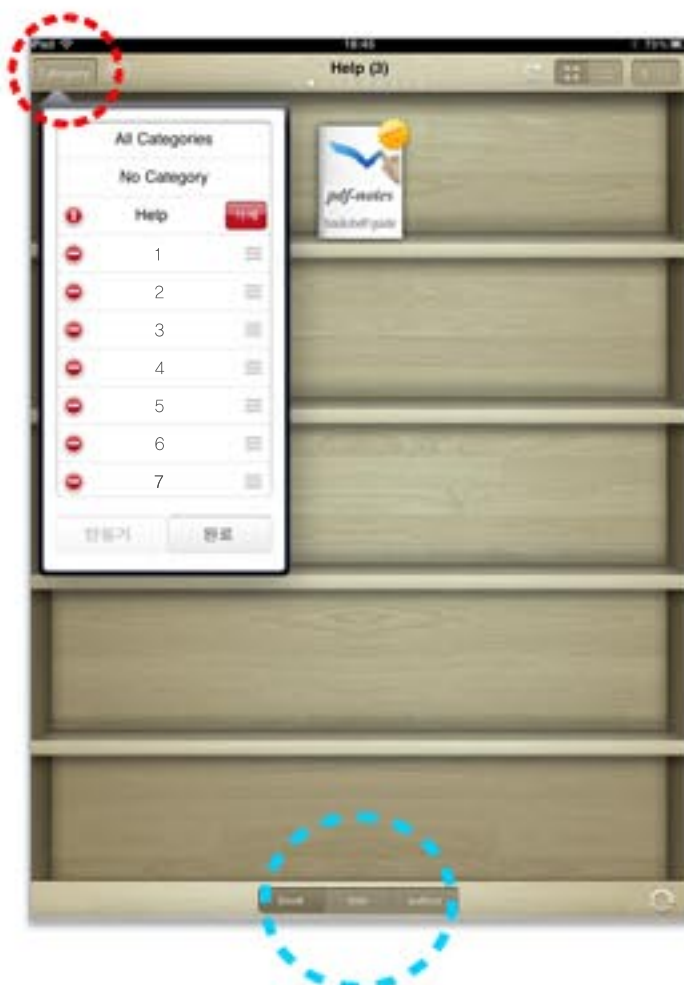
bookshelf



booklist

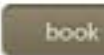
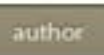
- 1 organize books by two types of  bookshelf and  booklist.

-  2 press  button to create new categories, change their name, change their order, remove them.

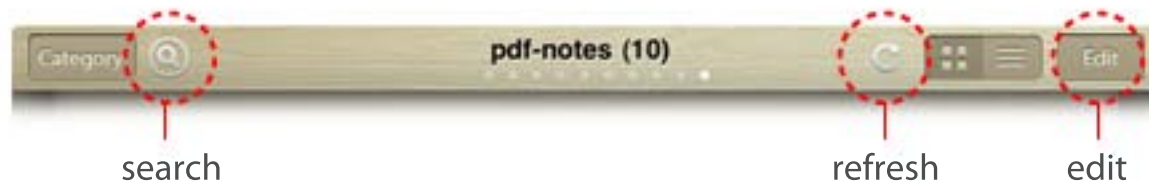


- 3 swipe screen horizontally to go to previous/next categories or press any category on the list.



- 4 press    button to sort by book order, title order, author order.

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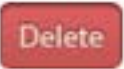

- 7 press  button to edit book information(title, author, tags, icon), delete books, move books to the other category.

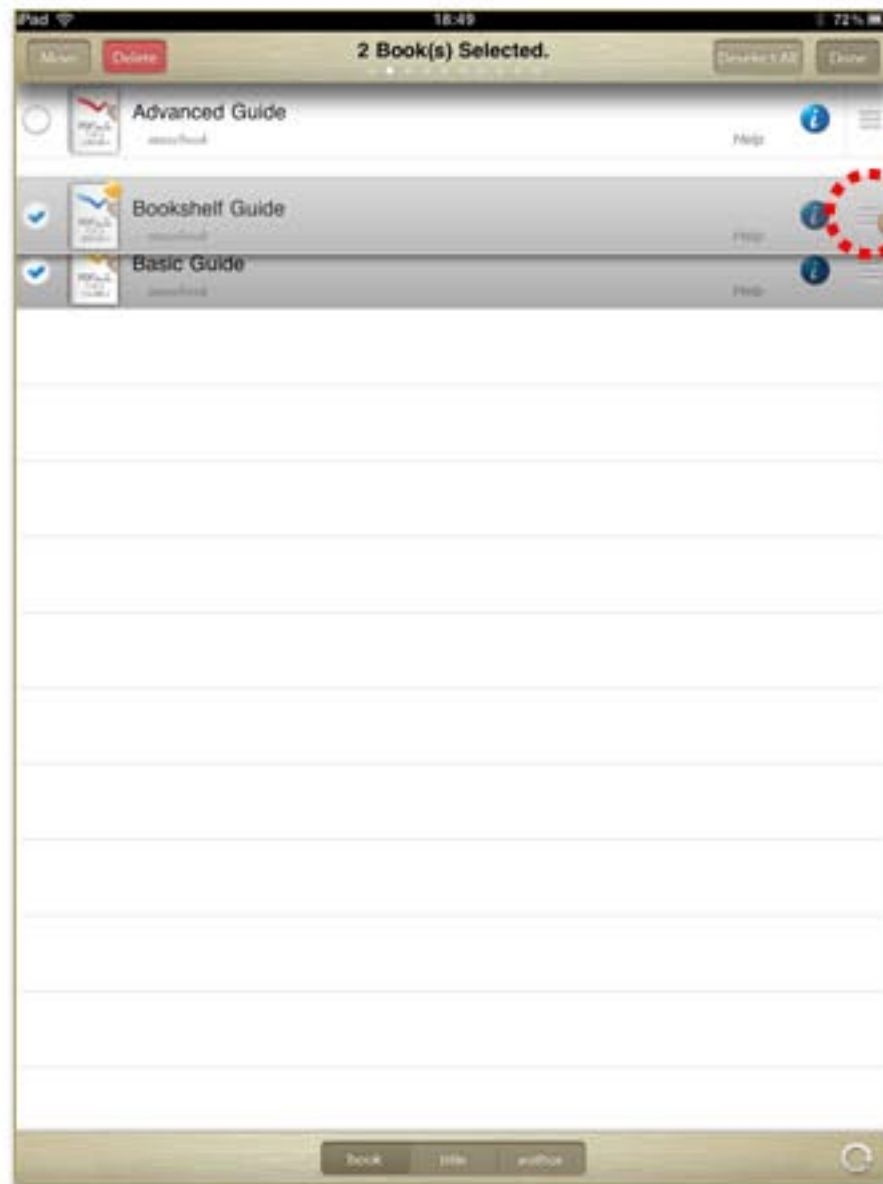


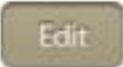
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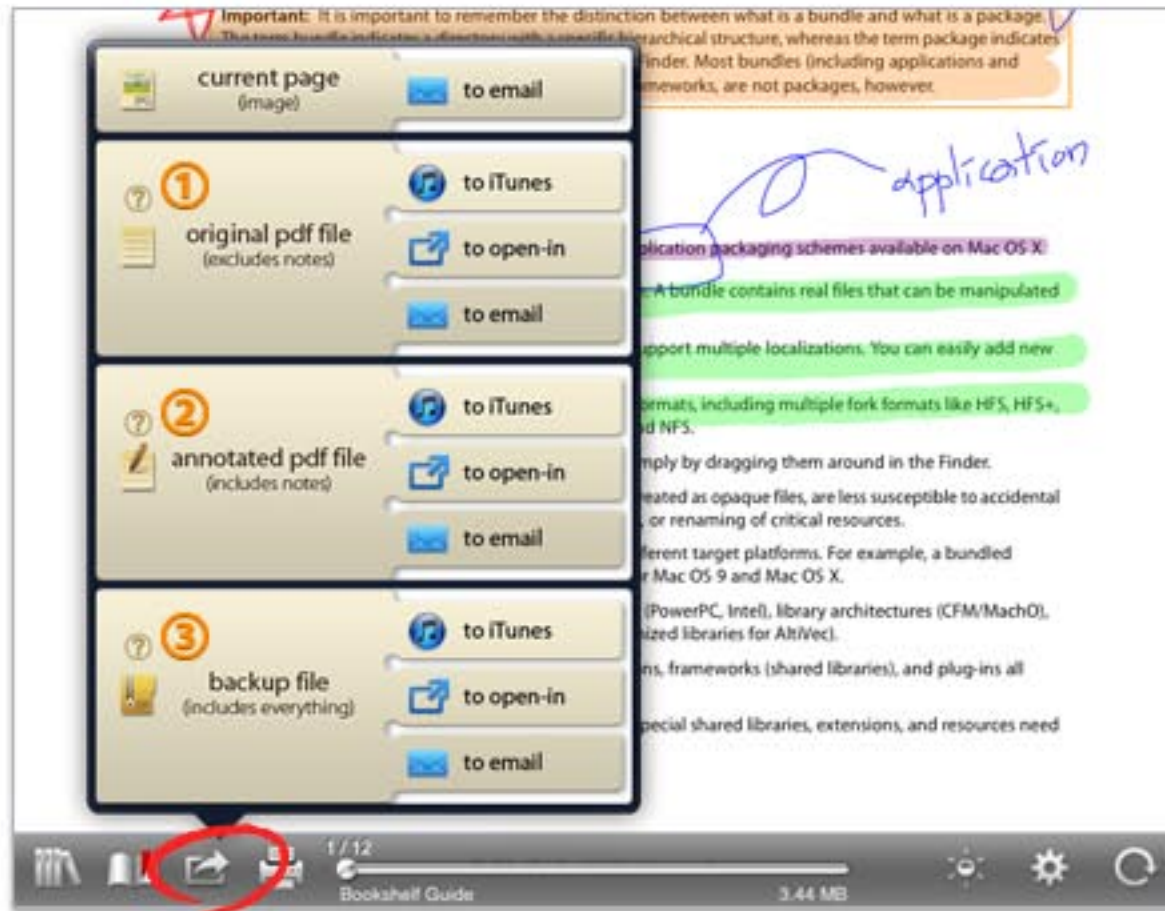
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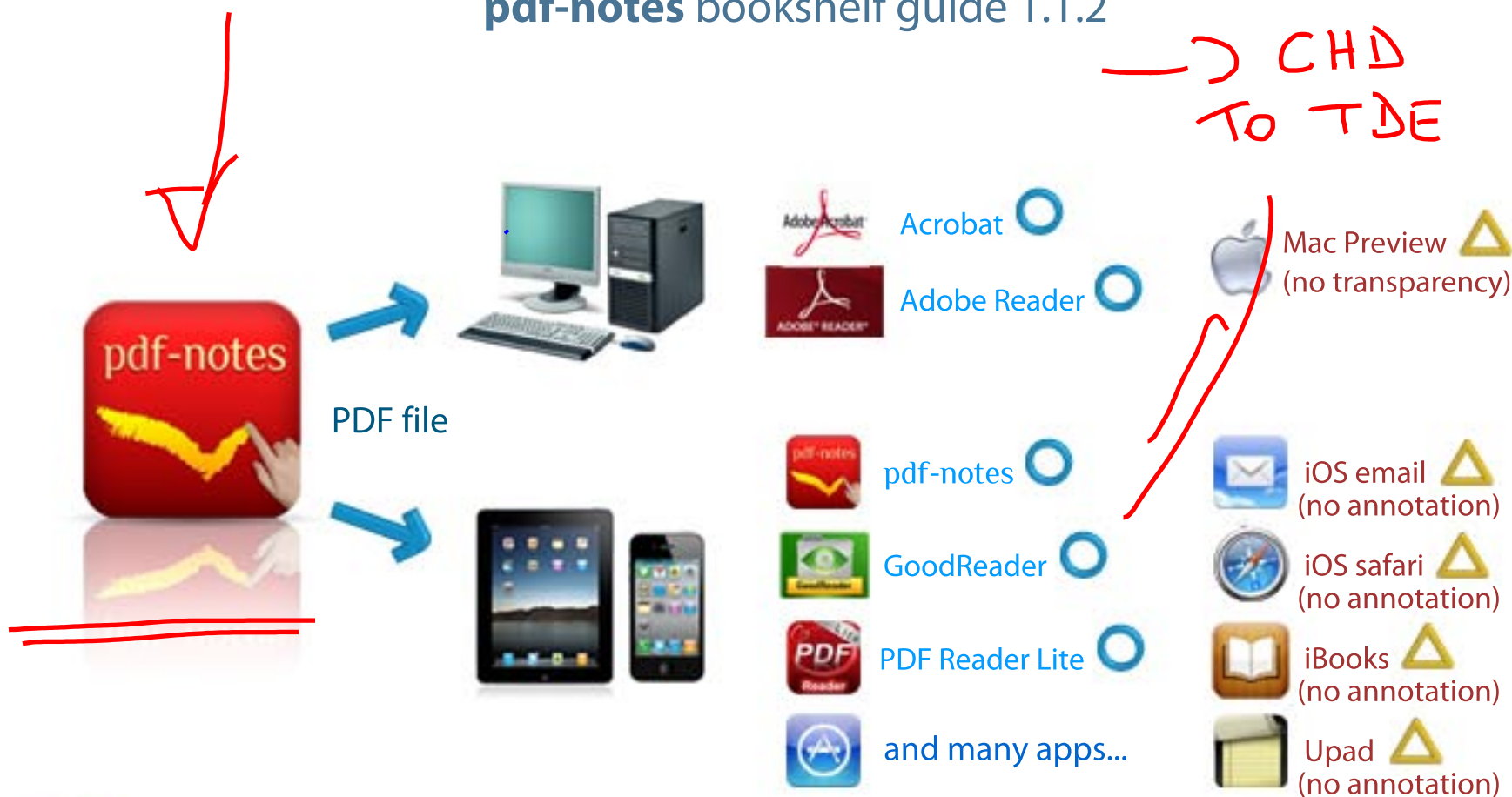


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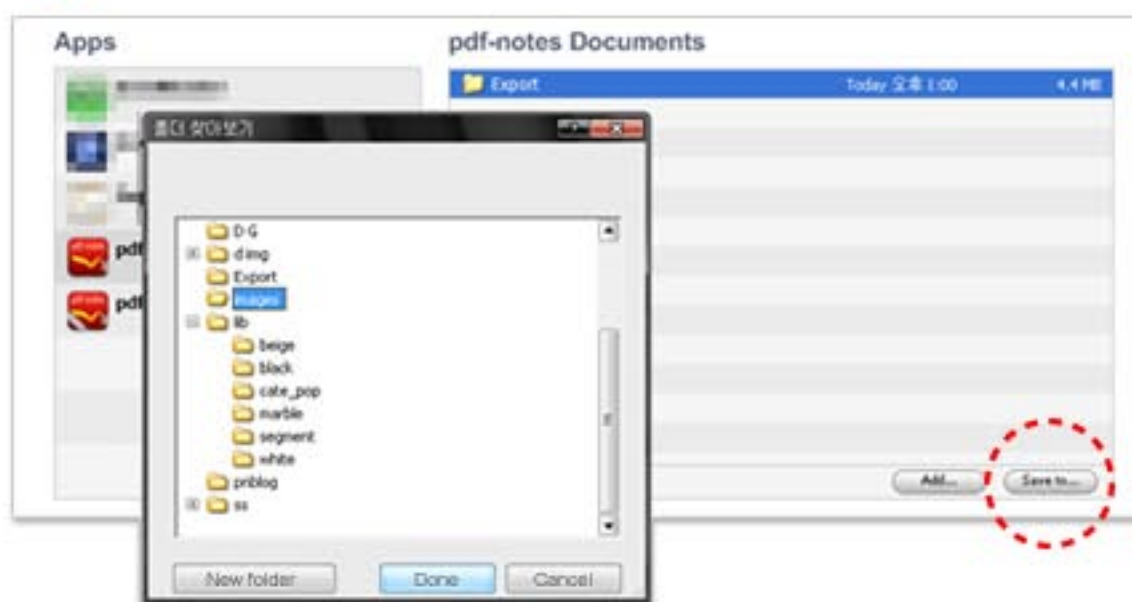


4 how to export documents to iTunes.

press  export button and click  to iTunes menu, you may see "Export completed" dialog so that "Export" folder is created in iTunes sharing directory.

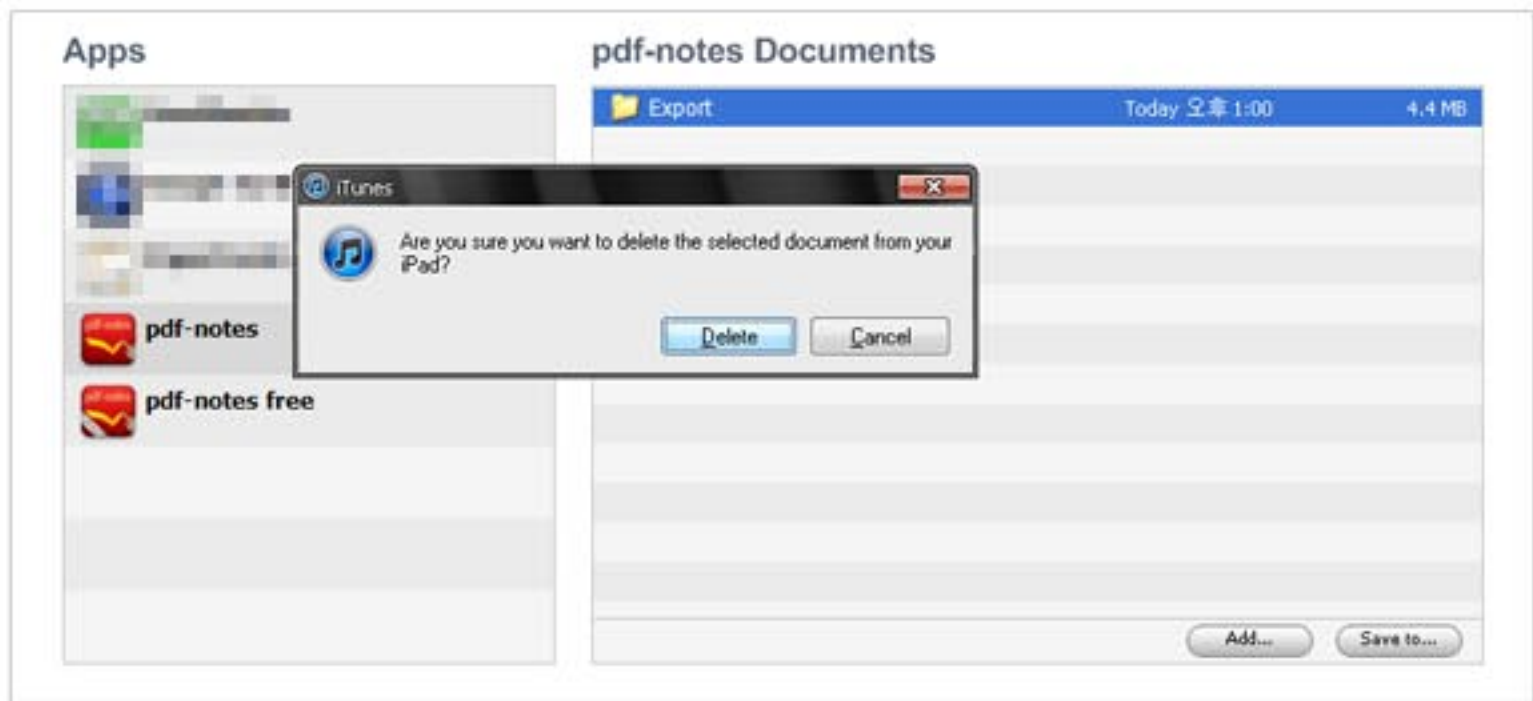


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select "Export" folder and press  button to save exported files into your PC or Mac.

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after saving exported files, delete "Export" folder on iTunes sharing "pdf-notes Documents."
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you can export multiple files to iTunes one by one, and the exported files are stored in "Export" folder; therefore, you can  the "Export" folder into your PC or Mac later, and remove it finally.

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
